He is a graduate of Eastern Michigan University with a BS in Political Science and Visual Arts and received his MFA in Choreography from The Ohio State University. Veal currently serves as president on the OhioDance Board of Trustees and additionally serves on the boards of Levitt Pavilions Dayton, HomeFull, WYSO, and Dayton Live. He can be seen as the host of the Emmy Award winning television series The Art Show on Think TV & CETCONNECT.

Jane D'Angelo has served as the OhioDance Executive Director since 2003. The Choreographers

Isabel Bowser is a dance artist and choreographer based in Columbus, Ohio.



She graduated from Alfred University in 2015 with a BFA in Visual Art and a minor in Dance. She is now a student in the dance MFA program at the Ohio State University. She made her Columbus debut at City Dance Showcase in 2021 and had the privilege of performing for Momar Ndiaye in the 2022 Fall Faculty Concert at OSU. In June of 2022, Isabel performed her solo KIBISIS in the

International Solo Tanz Theatre Festival in Stuttgart, Germany and was one of eight finalists. Themes of her work include intimacy, solitude, dream or mythic imagery and the Self in transformation.

Dancy received his BFA in Dance: Performance and Choreography from Ohio University. Upon Graduation he accepted a First Company position with the Dayton Contemporary Dance Co. Now residing in Columbus, OH

he continues his independent work through InPulse Dance Co. Dancy's works evokes emotions and aims to connect audiences by guiding them through genuine and visceral movement, inspired by human obstacles. The viewer is encouraged to create their own interpretation, and find life connections visually, physically and spiritually.

Amy Gibbons is from Huntington, WV and began her dance training with The



River Cities Dance Company in Greenup, KY. Amy graduated magna cum laude from Point Park University with a B.A. in Dance and performed professionally with the Dayton Contemporary Dance Company from 2008-2016. Additionally, she served as a guest artist with the company during the 2016-2018 seasons.

Amy is currently the DCDC Artist in Residence, Dance, and Performance Technology Program at The University of Dayton and co-director of the UD Dance Ensemble. She is also the UD resident choreographer for both musicals and operas performed at UD. Amy is a co-founder and Artistic Director of the pre-professional performance company, Onyx Contemporary Dance Company.

The Choreographers

Alisha Jihn | 靳書怡 (she/her) is a dancer, maker, and board-certified dance/



movement therapist. She holds dual degrees in Dance and Asian Studies from St. Olaf College and an M.A. from Columbia College Chicago in Dance/Movement Therapy and Counseling. Alisha was a Fulbright Fellow to Taiwan focused on cross-cultural dialogue about dance/movement therapy. In her professional career, she has danced for Wild Space Dance

Company and Danceworks Performance MKE, both based in Milwaukee, WI. Currently, she is a first-year MFA student in the Department of Dance at The Ohio State University. Her creative research interests delve into the intersection of memory, identity, and collective healing.

Born in Havana, Griset Damas-Roche studied at Cuba's Instituto Superior



de Arte and performed with the Ballet of Havana for five years. In 1998 she moved to Bogotá, Colombia, where she directed her own dance school and company, Ballet Caña Flamenca, for over 17 years. In 2014, she moved to Columbus, where she began teaching for the established Flamenco del Corazón school before opening her own flamenco studio, U Will Dance, in Plain

City. She has performed with Columbus Symphony Orchestra, Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra, and Symphony Orchestra of Princeton; has been the flamenco instructor for BalletMet's Intensive Summer Program; and presented at TedXColumbus in 2019. Griset proudly leads the Flamenco Company of Columbus and Caña Flamenca.

Jasmine Snellen, a present company member with Mutual Dance Theatre since



2019, served as Company Director for the 20-21 performance season, and currently works as the Marketing Manager with the organization. She was commissioned to create two new works for the company. Including FFIFF; a dance film project that explores society's rapidly shifting polarity, clashes of beliefs, and the tethers of groupthink. She also created Cingularity on MDT, which had its Aronoff Center debut in Spring 2022. Most recently, she choreographed new works for Miami University's

Dance Theatre ensemble, as well as the Youth Performing Arts School in Louisville. Through her work, she extends her mission of creating radical dance worlds that catalyze transformation.





Performance Adjudicators

James Gregg currently based in Los Angeles, Colorado born, Oklahoma raised, James Gregg is an international choreographer who has created works on Whim W'Him, Groundworks Dance Theater, Danceworks Chicago, Dark Circles Contemporary Dance, Ballet X, Northwest Dance Project, Nashville Ballet's Emergence, Springboard Danse Project Montreal, Elements Contemporary Ballet, and Cirque du Soleil at Sea. James was the recipient of the prestigious 2015 Princess Grace Choreography Fellowship Award. He was also the winner in 2015 of the NCC at Western Michigan University, in 2014 he won Ballet Austin's New American talent choreographic competition, and in 2011 the winner of the International Choreographic Competition at Festival des Arts de Saint-Sauveur. James is the co-founder along side Rauf Yasit, also known as Rubberlegz, a company based in Los Angeles known as Wewolf. They are a multi-disciplinary dance collective that is focused on creating and working on different projects that bring their methods of dance and visual arts together. http://www.jgchoreo.com/

Lionel Popkin is an artist born and raised in Indiana to an Indian mother and a Jewish father. His work questions how bodies, objects, and media exist in time and space, informed by his own mixed-race and multiple identity markers. Some of the cities where his work has been presented includes Los Angeles (where he is based), New York, San Francisco, Boston, Milwaukee, Philadelphia, London and Guangzhou. Lionel has performed as a dancer in the companies of Trisha Brown, Terry Creach, and Stephanie Skura. He has received grants from the National Performance Network's Creation Fund, the National Dance Project Touring Subsidy, the Center for Cultural Innovation, the Durfee Foundation, and the Mellon Foundation. Lionel has been commissioned by San Diego's Lower Left Performance Collective, the Li Chiao-Ping Dance Company, Carolyn Hall, and Nejla Yatkin. He is a Professor of Choreography in the Department of World Arts and Cultures/Dance at UCLA where he is also the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs in the School of the Arts and Architecture. He is a certified teacher of Skinner Releasing Technique, and a resident artist at the 18th Street Arts Center.

Afaliah Tribune is a New York City-based choreographer and a graduate of The Ohio State University with a BFA in Dance and an MA in Dance in the Professions from NYU Steinhardt. Tribune has toured and performed with Rennie Harris Puremovement, Bebe Miller, and Philip Hamilton's VOICES. She has also been featured on television specials for MTV and BET Networks. Her dance and music career have brought her to such places as Japan, Sweden, and Africa as a sought-after performer. She is currently on faculty at NYU's Steinhardt Dance Education Program and is Co-Advisor for the Dances of The African Diaspora track. Afaliah is the Creator and Director of TribuneLAB-a nineweek Dance Technique, Dance Therapy and Performance Intensive. An accomplished songwriter, Tribune has penned songs for CBS soap operas and has composed original vocal scores for independent choreographers and dance companies. Afaliah has showcased work at The Kennedy Center, Dance Africa, Radio City Music Hall, Middlebury College, New York University, and Jamaica Center for Arts and Learning. Tribune has taught master classes at The Ohio State University, Steps On Broadway, The New School, and Restoration Youth Dance Theater. As Artistic Director of Afaliah Tribune Dance, Tribune uses her various artistic skills as a dancer, rapper and singer to create a marriage between movement and music in a way that speaks largely to all audiences.

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
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
