



The Unstoppable Force that is Damien Highfield



Controlling the Uncontrollable

The Holidays are right around the corner and what do they bring, stress. Stress of spending, shopping, Holiday activities, extended family, Nutcracker, and traveling. While this time of year can be joyful it can also be stressful. What can you do to remain calm in a state of chaos and protect your energy when surrounded by things you cannot change?

Mindfulness.

Mindfulness is the practice of living in the moment and quieting your mind to observe your surroundings. While it may seem a silly and simple response it has shown to work. There are studies the show if you can pause your thinking and take long slow breaths or observe your surroundings you can prevent an anxiety attack. Some methods include 5,4,3,2,1; box breathing, lists, imagery, flowing river, or takingawalk.

The **5,4,3,2,1** method asks to point out 5 things you can see, 4 things you can touch, 3 things you can hear, 2 things you can smell, and 1 thing you can taste.

Box breathing is a way to center your breathing by breathing in for a count of 4, holding for 4.

exhale for 4 and pause for four. Deep breathing may also be used here. Take a deep breath in as deep as you can, close your eyes, and release everything. Sometimes you can feel the stress melt away.

Lists can range from sports, fruit, colors, the first 10 things you see, or any category you enjoy.

Imagery is closing your eyes, slowing your breathing, and creating a scene of calm.

Flowing river is where you imagine you are standing on a riverbank, and you see all your emotions and thoughts flowing towards you but instead of becoming anxious you watch them float by. You acknowledge their presence, but you do not dwell on them and let them rule your emotions.

Taking a walk is exactly how it sounds. Go outside for a walk, what do you see, what do you hear, and smell. Take a moment to feel the breeze/ sunshine. Look at all the colors surrounding you. Can you smell the crisp air, watch the falling leaves? Take a moment to really be present in your surroundings. Some people also have nature jars. They bring small jars or containers and collect things they see on their walk.


Apps- There are also several apps you can download that can play relaxing sounds, music, or take you through a breathing meditation. (i.e. Calm, Rethink Care, Headspace, Breathe)

While the Holidays bring about a slew of emotions in everyone, being present and utilizing these tools can help decrease your anxiety. Winter is the season of rest, recollection, gratefulness, and giving. It is a time of harvest, of restoration. The ebb and flow of the year has a purpose, and while it may be the busiest season for dancers it is also crucial to take care of yourself.
