

Recharge to Perform: The Power of Sleep for Dancers

Tiffany Marulli,PT, DPT,PhD, OCS

Getting enough sleep is essential for optimal cognitive and physical performance. This article reviews the importance of sleep for dancers and provides recommendations to develop a restorative sleep routine to maximize performance.

Why is sleepimportant for dancers?

Physical performance – poor sleep is correlated with delayed response time, fatigue, and decreased muscle activation.

Health – long-term sleep deprivation suppresses your immune system and increases your risk of developing heart problems,

type 2 diabetes, and high blood pressure.

Injury risk and recovery – sleep deprivation is associated with increased injury risk and delayed recovery from injuries.

Academic performance – sleep deprivation impairs cognitive performance, including focus, concentration, and problem solving.

Mental health – poor sleep is associated with poor emotional

 regulation and increases risk of mental health symptoms and disorders such as anxiety and depression.

How much sleep is enough?

Sleep needs differ among individuals, but most people are generally advised to get the following number of hours of sleep each night.

Age range	Recommended hours of sleep per night
School Age: 6-12 years	9-12 hours
Teen: 13-18 years	8-10 hours 7 or
Adult: 18 years or older	more hours

Dancer Health (Cont'd)

Tips for restorative sleep

- Maintain a regular and relaxing bedtime routine and sleep schedule.
- Get at least 20 minutes of natural light exposure in the morning.
- Work out regularly and early in the day.
- Avoid screens and bright blue light in the evening and before bed. Keep your bedroom cool (68 degrees or less), dark and comfortable.
- Avoid caffeine at least 6 hours prior to bedtime.
- Avoid watching the clock this can increase brain activity and anxiety.
- Avoid naps during the day if you have difficulty falling asleep at night.






